

Bead Spider Summer Gemstone Design Inspirations

1. This bracelet is made using two strands of tiger tail. Separate the strands every three beads to achieve the beaded ovals.

2. Thread a crimp or other small bead at the centre of the tiger tail bring the wires together and thread the pendant section of the necklace. Separate the wires and thread each side of the necklace then crimp each side to the bottom link of the chain. Make bead connectors to separate the chain links.

3. Single strand tiger tail bracelet.

4. The base of the bracelet is made using diamond shape links and the chain spacers. Two 4mm beads are made into bead connectors and attached to the chain spacers.

5. This bracelet is a series of bead connectors joined together. Make connectors with two or three beads. I have also made connectors using one bead and making large loops in opposite directions. To do this use the large end of the round-nose pliers.



6. This earring is simply plain loops above beads on head pins. Three pins are then attached to a jump ring and then an ear wire.

7. Bead connectors have been joined between the chain links.

8. Bead connectors have been joined between the chain links. A jump ring at the centre front joins each side of the necklace and the centre drop which is simply a plain loop above beads on a head pin attached to a link.

9. Plain loop above beads on head pins have been attached to circular links and also to the chain spacers in between however I have also added a jump ring to the spacers so it sits lower. Tigertail has been crimped to the end links either side of the necklace then threaded with beads to go around the back of the necklace to the clasp.

10. To achieve the centre triangle I have simply joined circular links using jumpring. I added a plain loop above beads on a head pin to the bottom link. The sides of the necklace have links joined with bead connectors. Tigertail has been crimped to the end links either side of the necklace then threaded with beads to go around the back of the necklace to the clasp.
